<u>Tuition</u>

Please make sure that medical forms are processed and that all financial obligations are met by the orientation date. For your convenience you may pay with:

A) Two post-dated checks of equal amounts, dated September 6, 2018 and January 1, 2019

B) Ten monthly post-dated checks, dated September 6, 2018 through June 1, 2019

<u>School Hours</u> Mon-Thurs: 9:00 am - 3:30 pm Friday: 9:00 am - 12:30 pm The first day of school is Thursday, September 6, 2018.

Bus Service

Busing is provided through the Great Neck Public Schools. Parents should register their children the Great Neck Public School Department of Transportation at (516) 441-4060 before the start of the school year. In the event that your child will be absent, be sure to inform the bus company beforehand.

<u>Arrivals</u>

Classroom doors open at 9:00 am. Teachers use the time before school for meetings and to prepare for the day's activities and cannot properly supervise the children whilst engaged in their work. Early arrivals will be required to wait with their parent until 9:00 am. In order to establish good school patterns from the start, children should arrive on time. Latecomers miss an important part of our program can be disruptive to the class.

Early Pickup

If it is absolutely necessary to take your child home before the end of the school day, you must sign your child out in the office. Please do not pick up your child without first informing the school office.

<u>Absences</u>

In the event that you plan to take a family trip during the time in which school is in session, please notify the school before of the days that your child will be absent. Please note that we do not reimburse tuition fees for days absent.

Parental Absences

Please inform the school if you will be away from home for any length of time. This is especially important if the absence is due to special occasions, such as hospitalization for the birth of a sibling. When teachers are aware of such conditions they can greatly assist in alleviating a child's concerns regarding his or her mother's absence.

<u>Apparel</u>

Students are required to wear the school uniform, available through Land's End. Please refer to the enclosed dress code.

<u>Food</u>

Several of our students have allergies and sensitivities to nuts as well as dairy. All food sent from home must be nut free. All snacks must be <u>nut</u> and <u>dairy</u> free.

<u>Tzedaka</u>

Please send in a few pennies each day to put in the tzedaka box.

<u>Birthdays</u>

Teachers provide a variety of special activities to make your child's birthday special and unique. You may bring a cake or cupcakes and a gift for the entire class to enjoy. We request that if you choose to distribute party bags they contain a limited amount of sugary snacks. All foods must be *Pas Yisrael, Chalav Yisrael (if dairy), and Kemach Yashan.* Please call your child's teacher at least one week in advance to schedule a date for the birthday party. Please bring pennies for tzedaka for the entire class and ask your child to prepare a birthday resolution, a new mitzvah that they would like to be careful with in honor of their birthday. No birthday parties will be held during the time allotted to the music teacher.

<u>Homework</u>

Homework is sent home each day for the purpose of reinforcing the material taught that day. Practicing reading daily is of critical importance in attaining good reading skills. Teachers make efforts to keep homework assignments to a minimum.

School Announcements

School announcements and updates are sent via whatsapp messages and email. Magen Israel Parents will be added to the whatsapp broadcast for school notices, photos and videos. Please avoid WhatsApp messaging teachers and faculty after hours.

School Records

Parents should notify the office promptly, in writing, of any change in address, telephone numbers, and information regarding emergency contacts. Promptness and accuracy are necessary in keeping our records up to date. The school needs to be able to communicate with parents whenever necessary.

Snow Closing

When setting the calendar, the school takes into consideration that some days will be closed due to snow. In the event of a snow closing, you'll be notified via WhatsApp or you can call the school number to hear a school-closing recording.

Lunch Program

Magen Israel is proud to offer a daily hot lunch program. The cost of the program is **\$600 for the school year**. For more information and to enroll your child in this optional program, please contact the school office.

Parent Teacher Conferences

Parent Teacher Conferences are held in November. If you feel the need to discuss your child's progress with his/her teacher at any time, please call the school and leave a message for the teacher. Your call will be returned at the teacher's earliest convenience.

PTA Dues

In order to cover the costs of Pizza Tuesday, Teacher's Gifts and other special programs throughout the year, Magen Israel requires that every child submit a mandatory **PTA Due of \$180**. Please submit this amount to the school office or your Class Mom at the beginning of the year. Checks can be made payable to *Gan Israel PTA*.

Health Policy

The health of all of our children is partially dependent on the cooperation of the parents. Sending a sick child to school not only jeopardizes the health of that child, but the health of all of the child's classmates as well.

- Children must be free of fever for at least 24 hours before returning to school.
- Children must be free of diarrhea for at least 24 hours before returning to school.
- Children requiring antibiotics must be on it for at least 24 hours before returning to school.
- No child with an infectious disease is permitted to attend school.
- Children must have a doctor's note indication that they are fit to return to school following an infectious disease.
- If a teacher deems a child too sick to be exposed to other children, she will call a parent or other relatives listed on the emergency card and ask them to pick up their child.
- No child with pink eye will be permitted in school.
- Teachers are not authorized to administer any medication to children.
- There will be a lice check at the start of the school year, after every major vacation, and whenever the administration deems necessary. Any child found with lice or nits will be sent home.

• In case of accidental injury G-d forbid, the school will immediately attempt to contact a parent. If we are unable to contact the parent, the child's physician will be called. If necessary, the school will also call an ambulance and paramedics. Until the arrival of the parents, the director or teacher will be responsible for making decisions regarding the child's welfare. Parents will be expected to assume responsibility for any resultant expenses not covered by the school's insurance. The school will maintain a parent's signed consent form, agreeing to this provision.

• All medical forms must first be submitted to the school office before your child can begin attending school.

• Please inform your child's teacher of any allergies that your child may have, even if you have already noted it on the registration form. It is important that you notify the teacher in person and ensure that she is well aware of the extent of the allergic reaction. If your child requires an Epi Pen, make sure to provide the school with one. Please make sure that all pertinent information on the emergency card be given upon your arrival to school.

Classes visit the pool once a month. Swim sessions rely on the support of our parent body as parent volunteers are needed to assist with driving and chaperoning. If you're able to volunteer, please let the office know.

Field Trips

Field trips are an educational and exciting part of early childhood programs. Notices will be sent home at least one week in advance to inform you of the upcoming trip. You will be required to sign a permission slip allowing your child to join the school trip.

Special Events

Our monthly events include visits from the Petting Farm, Small Wonder Puppet Theater, the Dentist, Meet the Author, Matza Factory, Book Fair, Chinese Auction, Sofer, and more. Parents will be notified before each event.

Chinese Auction

Our annual Chinese auction is a vital part of supporting our school. Each parent is required to submit an **auction fee of \$100.** This fee must be submitted together with PTA dues at the start of the school year and includes auction entry tickets for school parents.
